You are:

- An independent contractor.
- Responsible for marketing yourself.
- Required to make your travel arrangements for all assignments.

Instructor Roster and Course Portfolio

IRWA HQ staff maintains the Instructor Roster and each Instructor's Course Portfolio.

PIPE and IRWA HQ will assess the qualifications of each instructor and determine which courses the instructor is permitted to teach.

Instructor Qualifications

The PIPE and IRWA HQ staff develops and implements the discipline and industry-specific instructor qualifications. The PIPE reserves the right to appoint and/or approve instructors for any course(s) based on the needs of IRWA. Additional training may be required.

Please Note: All CLIMB-certified instructors (New and Veteran) have been matched to the courses they are approved to instruct based on information (experience and credentialing) they submitted to the PIPE. If the instructor has been matched, all courses they are approved to teach are on the website. An instructor teaching any course for the first time will be assigned a CLIMB coach by PIPE (the instructor does not need to take the course to teach it- CLIMB Coaching is required). The CLIMB coach will assist the instructor in reviewing the Lesson Plan and providing recommendations prior to the course; be available by telephone, email or text messaging during the course; and conduct a debrief with the instructor once the course is concluded. Additional coaching may be required on the next instructional assignment.
