RWA's Annual Education Seminar in Albuquerque this past June was the occasion of an important announcement between the Association and the Federal Highway Administration. FHWA's Director of the Office of Real Estate Services, Susan Lauffer, presented the "Partnering Agreement" to IRWA President Stephanie Rankin, SR/WA during the opening ceremonies of the seminar. In her remarks, Ms. Lauffer said that the executed Partnering Agreement was a further strengthening of the long-standing relationship between the two organizations and will serve

to "address critical training needs that will better serve our mutual "customers" as we begin the 21st century."

A task force to begin the process of implementing the Partnering Agreement met in Washington, D.C., on July 22. The task force is made up of representatives from FHWA, IRWA, the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials and the National (AASHTO) Highway Institute (NHI). Several important issues regarding training opportunities with the state highway departments (DOTs) were discussed as well as the opportunity to provide a training/ certification program for consultants doing work for state DOTs.

An aggressive schedule for implementing many of these efforts is being developed and will be announced soon.
